




The Participants

- 137 in attendance with a total of 149,355 acres of cropland and 89,126 acres of small grains represented
- 51 farmers received pesticide license credits
- 39 commercial pesticide applicators received a total of 78 credits, which preserved a total of \$242,424 in wages and saved them \$1,560 in registration fees
- When asked if they had benefited from previous small grain field days, 35 participants had an average yield increase of 5.8 bushels per acre for a total value of \$2,776,925





The charts are based on 79 evaluations completed out of 137 participants, which is a return rate of 58%.
